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## PREFACE

The tables included in this volume are the by-products of investigations into the history of Eurasian commerce with the Sung. I reconstructed the richly documented sequence of events connected with each of the various tribute embassies that arrived at Chinese borders between 960 and 1126 to be used as surrogate data for lacunae in the much smaller body of sources of information on strictly commercial activities. This enabled me to establish the frequency of contacts with various foreign states, the duration of ventures to China, the periodicity of such enterprises, and the multiple functions of "diplomatic" missions. The quality and quantity of the collected material seemed of such value as to warrant the preparation of a separate work.

A book, tentatively entitled "Tribute Missions, Foreign Trade, and International Politics in China, 960-1260," will contain the tables that constitute the present volume, the missing Japanese table, the reconstruction of a smaller number of Southern Sung embassies, the tabulation of the aboriginal missions from South, Southwest and West China, and introductory essays on the tribute system during the Sung, the interconnections between tribute and trade (accompanied by tabulations of tribute lists), and a discussion of international politics during the Sung from the perspective of the embassies to the Chinese court. But the final draft of this manuscript will not be finished for two or three years--after completion of the foreign trade study, a book on imperial fiscal administration, and editing of an economic history conference volume--and it seemed to me desirable to informally "publish" the completed material so that it could be used in the meantime by interested scholars as well as to attract the widest possible critical comments. I claim no special expertise in the histories and languages of many of the foreign countries represented in these tables--for example, the peoples of Inner, Maritime Southeast, South and Southwest Asia--and, although I expect to consult with specific scholars about the orthography and transcription of foreign words, I hope that specialists using this material will transmit their corrections. In particular, many names and terms

are merely the Wade-Giles transcriptions of Chinese transliterations that are connected together, in many cases, by arbitrary and questionable hyphenization. I hope that making this material available will attract the widest possible correspondence from scholars with suggestions as to how to resolve such problems and thereby contribute to a better final product.

The organization of these tables, for the most part, should be clear. Each mission is separately numbered, and the different events lettered and numbered, with the notes at the end of each table keyed to these numbers and letters. Dates in the text of the tables are conversions to the western calendar whereas those in the footnotes are the original lunar ones. Intercalary months are indicated with an asterix (e.g. 4\*). The Chinese characters in the text were the work of Ms. Angela Sheng and those in the bibliography were prepared by Mr. Chu Nan.
